
We the senior class of 1969 dedicate our yearbook, the Argo, to Mr. and Mrs. Jordan for their time and effort.


acted as the cheerleading advisor, helping to encourage school spirit.


Adam's Tom Mandt drives forward after being tackled by Grand Meadow player.

#### Fans Cheer Varsity's March To Victory

The Adams Tigers football team of 1968 proved to be one of the best on record, finishing the year with a 7-2 record. It was the first time our team had finished with more than six victories since 1957. Second place in the Southland Conference was also one of the high points of the season.

The year was started with eleven returning lettermen. Co-captains for 1968 were Bob Knutson and Rich Wolff. They were aided by four other returning senior lettermen who helped lead the team.

Crashing blocks, bone-crunching tackles, and tremendous catches were some of the occurences this year. The switch of Bob Knutson from end to quarterback proved to be an inspirational move, as he led the offense for the entire year. Tom Prescott won the individual scoring race in the area with 81 points. He also proved to be the ball carrier we went to when we needed yardage. Larry Voigt and Tom Mandt were the top ball carriers. Voigt ended the year with over 1000 yds. in total offense. He also set a school record when he rushed for 251 yds. against Elkton.

One of the bright spots was the blocking of the offensive line led by Randy Emanuel, Ron Wolff, Dave Wiste, and Mark Wolterman, all juniors. They, time and time again, opened up holes which enabled our

backs to go for good yardage.

The defensive unit limited their opponents to an average of only 5.2 points per game, the second best in the area. Linebackers Rich and Ron Wolff paced the defense. They received substantial help from John Arvold and Bob Schmitz, two great defensive ends. Dave Fasbender also proved to be a good middle guard. Halfback, Bob Knutson, set a school record with ten interceptions. Defense is one of the most important things in football and this years' team exemplified good defense.

Much of the credit this year has to go to our two coaches, Mr. Nordquist and Mr. Espe. They have proven to be two very fine leaders of young men. Through their fine coaching and examples they have given the school a fine spirit of winning that will be carried on in the future.



#### Adams Overpowers Old Rivals

The Adams Tigers closed out their 1968 season on a successful note as they defeated Grand Meadow. The final score was 14-0. The victory over the Larks was the first by the Tigers since 1957. Although the Tigers scored only twice they were in control of the game more than the score indicated. The Tigers scored first in the second quarter on a 22 yard pass from Bob Knutson to Tom Mandt. Larry Voigt made the conversion to make the score 7-0. The second touchdown in the second half came after a pass from Knutson to Bob Schmitz was completed on the 20 yard line. Five plays later, Tom Prescott followed Mark Wolterman's block into the end zone. Voigt again converted the point after the touchdown. At the end of the game, the Tigers were threatening again, but time elapsed before they could move the ball across the goal line. Defensively, the Tigers seemed to let up and Grand Meadow was able to drive to the 4 yard line and had a first down and goal to go. On the first play Ron Wolff stopped it for a yard gain. John Arvold, with the help of Randy Emanuel, stopped the second for a net loss of three yards. Grand Meadow then tried the middle but was stopped after a yard by Dave Wiste, Dave Fasbender, and Rich Wolff. The Larks then were forced to take a time out. When play resumed they tried a

quarterback sweep to the left, but Bob Schmitz, with the help of Tom Mandt, knocked the quarterback out of bounds on the two yard line. Adams was then able to march out of the shadow of its own goal, thanks to some hard running by Larry Voigt and Tom Mandt. Much credit must be given to the whole team for this long awaited victory over Grand Meadow.



The managers did a real fine job this year taking care of all the aches and pains of the athletes. Their own incentive was the reason why many good improvements were made in our locker rooms this past year.


Pep, Spirit, and Enthusiasm, were only a few of the many things that were promoted by the cheerleaders at Adams High.

support from the "B" Team who did a great job on their part. Mrs. Jordan also worked hard with the cheerleaders, as it was an aid and help in their performance.


This year the fans of Adams High, along with the help of our great band have cheered our team on to victory. As usual we can be proud of our school spirit and hope it will continue to grow in the future.





## Season's Efforts Are Rewarding For Tigers








The Junior Class, under the direction of Mr. Jordan, demonstrated it's dramatic ability in the presentation of the play Dino.





The band will be practicing for Commencement and the Memorial Day Parade.



Education and knowledge are the gateway to our future careers. The faculty of Adams High has certainly done its best to lead us to this gateway.




#### Personnel Strive To Meet School Demands
